A. T. Work Trips From 11/19/2022 to 12/15/2022

11/19 - Jim Rugh, Leanne Butler, Amy Webb -Clingmans Dome to Goshen Prong Tr - Last opportunity to check my AT section before the Clingmans Dome Road closes for the winter.

11/21 - Taylor Weatherbee - Sugarland Mt Tr to Collins Gap - Cleaned out 35 water bars and drainage ditches. Also cleaned out 2 turnpikes, measuring 40 and 96 feet including their drainage ditches.

11/26 - Randy Bullock, Sunaree Bullock - Brown Fork Gap to Stekoah Gap - Strolling up this section on a beautiful winter day clearing water bars, several small blow downs. Walked proposed relocation route near Brown Fork Gap shelter.

11/26 - Taylor Weatherbee - Sugarland Mt Tr to

Collins Gap - Cleaned out the last 18 water bar/drainages at south end of our section, then 19 water bars/drainages located between our section and the Bill Pyle/Rick Hughes section. Cleared one small blowdown and reset one stone step. Then relocated to the trail down to the Collins shelter and cleared all but around 6 water bars down near the shelter.

11/28 - Patricia Bryant, Peter Lloyd - Mt Love to

Clingmans Dome - Cleaned out the diversion channels in front of the waterbars. Reinforced the front edge of several waterbars where erosion has taken place. Redug some diversion side-channels to divert water off the trail.

11/28 - Taylor Weatherbee - Sugarland Mt Tr to Collins Gap - Cleaned the rest of the water bars. Built a short turnpike in the lowest one near shelter that was boggy. Cleaned drainages around shelter.

11/29 - Keith Mertz, Melanie Harmon, David Gall,

Debbie Waddell, Debra Barton - Yellow Creek Gap to Cody Gap - Five volunteers went over to Yellow Creek Gap and cleaned water bars, lopped lots of greenbrier, and removed two small blowdowns laying across trail.

11/30 - Rick Hughes - Collins Gap to Mt Love -Completed clearing all waterbars on the section, including some vegetation trimming to permit waterbar access.

12/4 - Ernie Wiles - Tricorner Knob Shelter - Cleaned shelter and filled mulch pails in shelter.

12/4 - Lisa Sumter - Davenport Gap to Chestnut Br Trail - Cleared around 60 waterbars/drainages between the shelter & Chestnut Gap trail. Removed downed branches from trail. Picked up micro trash.

12/10 - Lisa Sumter - Davenport Gap to Chestnut Br Trail - Cleaned out the waterbars & removed downed limbs from the first mile of trail. Sawed & removed a trip hazard of rhododendron branches which were a casualty of a blowdown. Checked shelter area.

12/11 - Diane Petrilla - Club Mgt, Mtgs & Admin -

Performed all database reports for calculation of annual ATMC maintainer awards from Club and ATC, as well as ATPO report. Ordered needed awards and assembled all for distribution, either in person or by mail. Distributed at banquet and mailed at PO.

12/12 - Franklin LaFond - Trail Assessments - Joined Heath from Forest Service, Morgan and Sara from ATC to run flag line and get GPS track for upcoming trail relocation south of Brown Fork Shelter. Inspected Brown Fork Shelter and noted a couple of potential issues that will need to be addressed in the future, but not immediate. We will continue to monitor these issues to determine rate of progress and establish a plan for addressing. Discussed current status of status of Cable Gap Shelter and next steps. Phase 1 work on road widening project near Stecoah Gap has started. Had an opportunity to talk with crew manager regarding schedule. The land bridge portion of the project is Phase 2, targeted to begin late 2023 or early 2024. Sarah has meeting this week with NCDOT to discuss project updates.

12/13 - Mark Snyder, Janet Snyder - Sweat Heifer to Newfound Gap - Cleaned all waterbars, for the third time in the lower portion of our section. Some of the drainage was full of leaves and twigs. Hopefully, today's rain will tamp the leaves down, thus the wind is less likely to blow them back into the waterbars.
